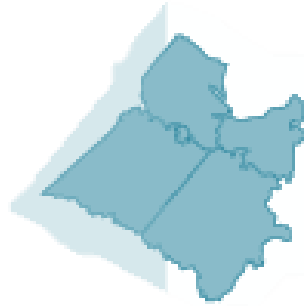

Operated by the *Fredericksburg Area Regional Health Council* and with the assistance of hundreds of volunteers, the Lloyd F. Moss Free Clinic provides a range of outpatient services including: preventative and acute care; chronic disease management; prescription assistance; specialty referrals; health and wellness education; dental services; and psychosocial assessment and referral. Our pharmacy also serves as a central-fill pharmacy for 12+ other free clinics. We strive to connect patients to resources for identified social needs that affect health, such as housing, food and utility assistance.
